THE 8th COMPUTER OLYMPIAD

Casineum, Graz, Austria November 23-27, 2003

The 8th Computer Olympiad was held in Graz, Austria from November 23 to 27, 2003. With much pleasure we remark that Graz played its role as the European cultural capital of the year 2003 very well. Next to the 11th WCCC, the 8th Computer Olympiad and 10th ACG conference were held in this city. We gratefully acknowledge the support of the City of Graz by three prominent sponsors, Pro:Holz, the Casino Graz, and Fujitsu Siemens. The ICGA supported Graz in all its activities with game-technical means from Maastricht, The Netherlands, where the Faculty of General Sciences of the Universiteit Maastricht, SARA, NCF / NWO, the Maastricht Chess Club (VSM), and IKAT acted as a kind of twin city of Graz.

The Computer Olympiad was split in many different competitions, each having their own playing program and their own rules. Jonathan Schaeffer served as the Tournament Director and Mark Winands as the Assistant Tournament Director. The Olympiad hosted thirteen games: Abalone, Amazons, Backgammon, Chinese Chess, Dots and Boxes, Draughts, Go 19 × 19, Go 9 × 9, Hex, Lines of Action, Poker, RoShamBo, and Shogi.
